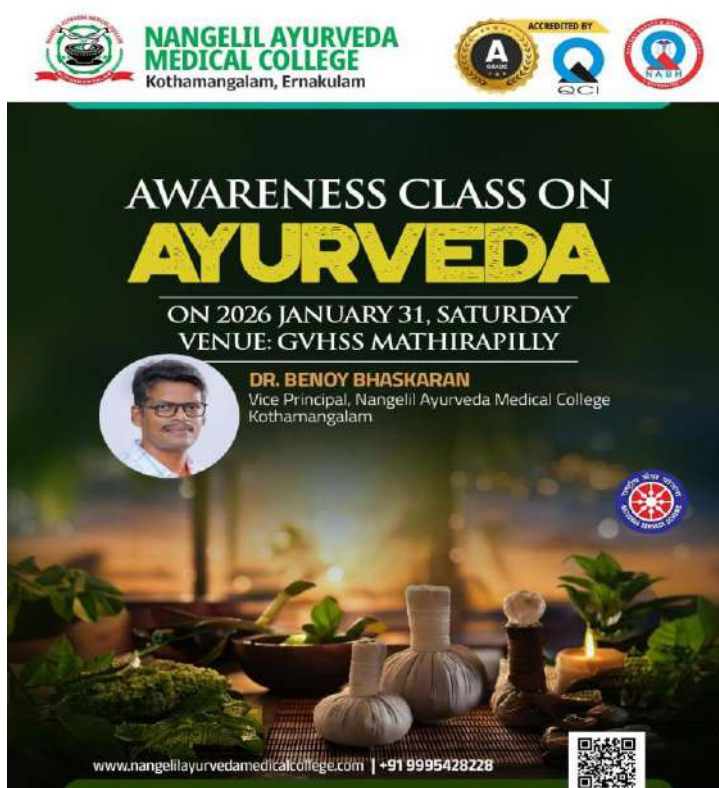

HPV VACCINATION TRAINING SESSION

An HPV Vaccination Training session was conducted on 16 January 2026 from 2:00–3:00 PM at the Library Basement Hall of Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Medical College Hospital, organized by IMA Karakonam in collaboration with IMA–MSN and WIMA under the guidance of IMA Headquarters and FOGSI.

The objective of the session was to enhance awareness and implementation strategies related to HPV vaccination and to strengthen the role of healthcare professionals and NSS volunteers in vaccine advocacy and preventive oncology.

The session was delivered by Dr. Anu J, Vice President of IMA Karakonam, who explained the pathology of HPV infection, cancer risks and the importance of vaccination in the 9–14-year age group. The discussion was moderated by Dr.

Rinu Chandran, Assistant Professor of OBG, who linked the pathology with its clinical relevance in gynecological practice.

Key topics included the global and national burden of HPV, epidemiology of HPV-related diseases, vaccine efficacy and schedule and strategies to address vaccine hesitancy through effective parental counseling. A total of 168 participants, including NSS volunteers, MSN members and IMA members, attended the session.

The program concluded with an interactive discussion and role-play conducted by Dr. Aippuru and Dr. Anagha, reinforcing the importance of HPV vaccination and motivating participants to actively engage in community awareness and preventive health initiatives.

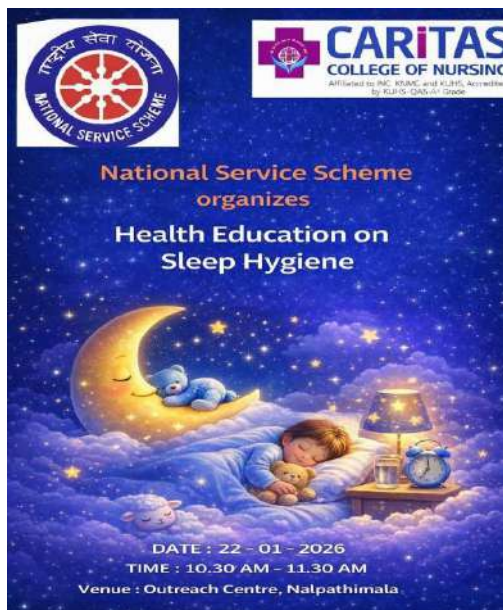

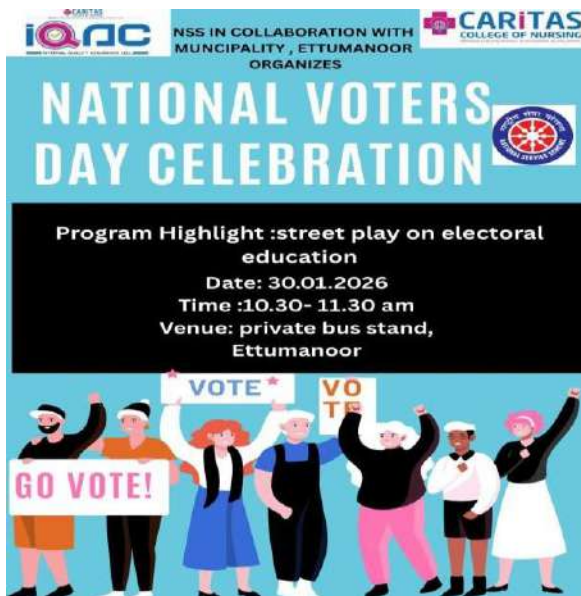

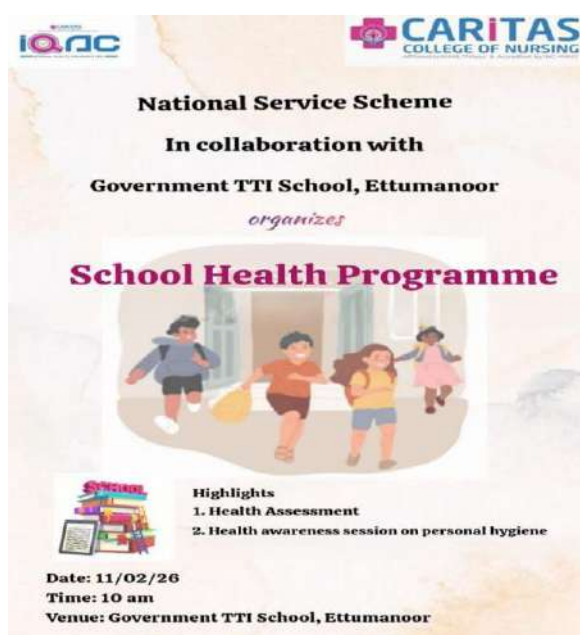

REPORT OF LEPROSY DAY PROGRAMME

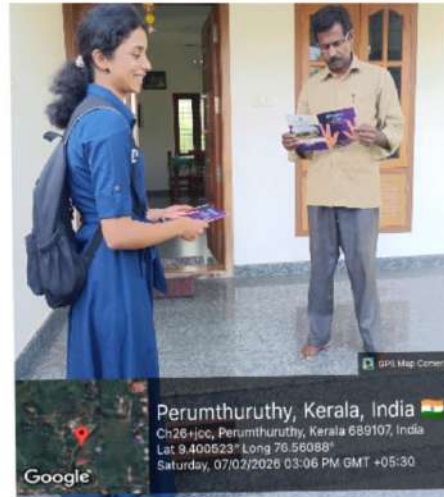


3. WORLD LEPROSY DAY 2026

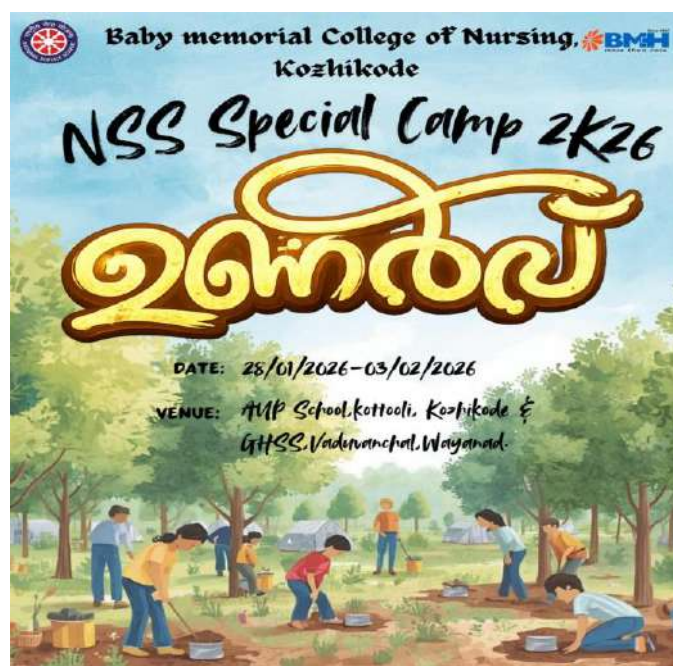

ORIENTATION

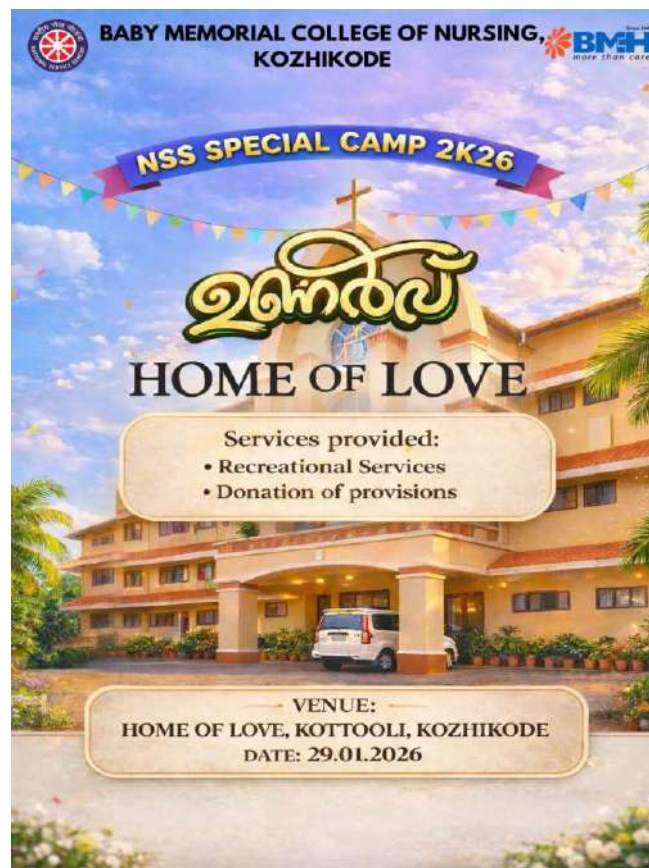

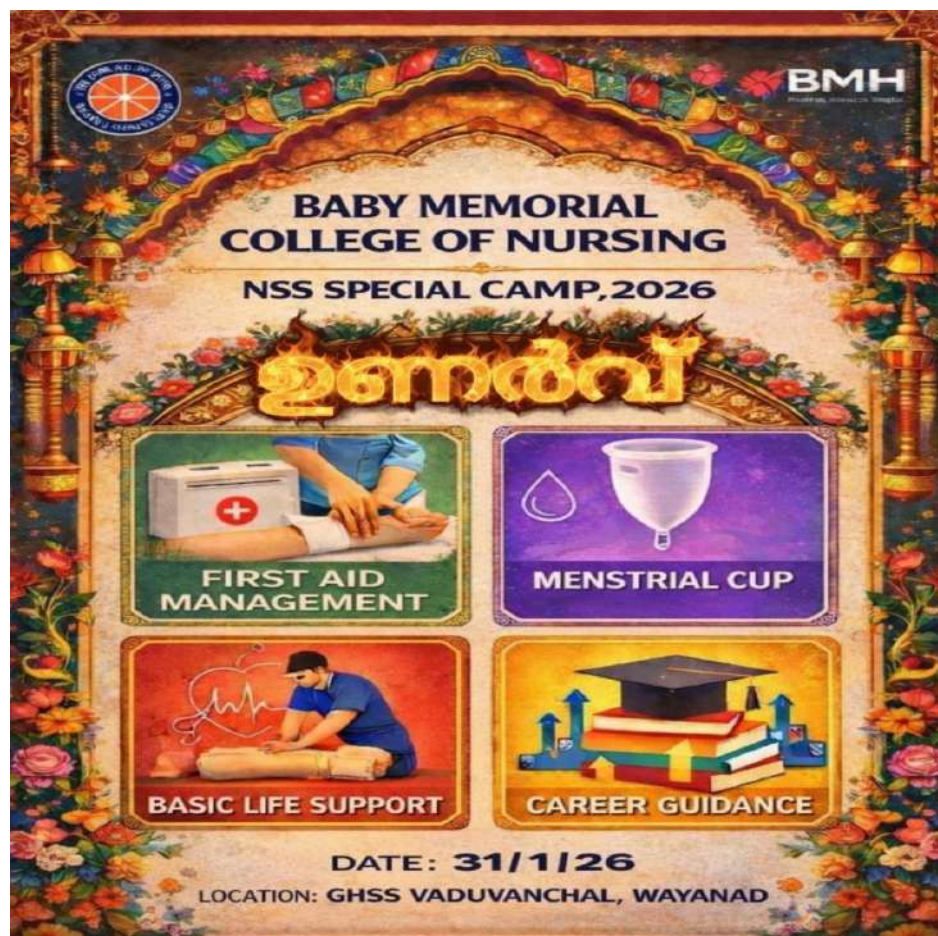


SESSION ON ELECTORAL LITERACY

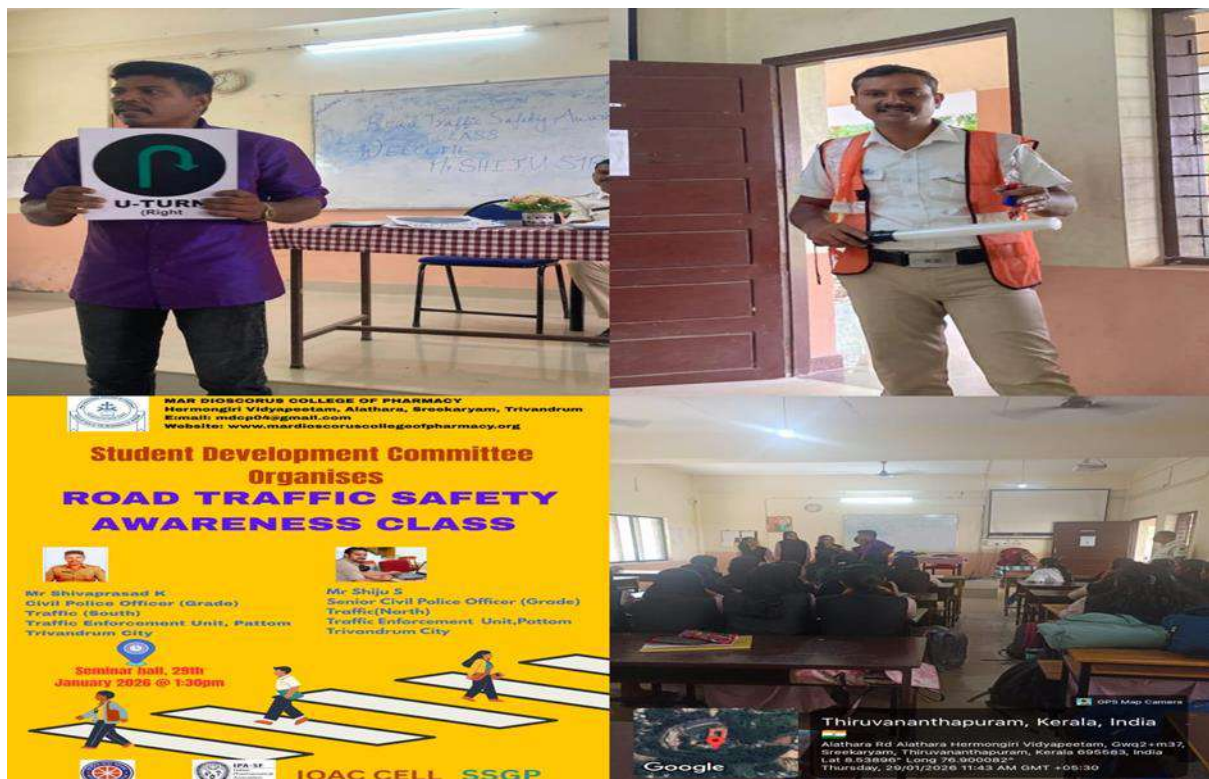
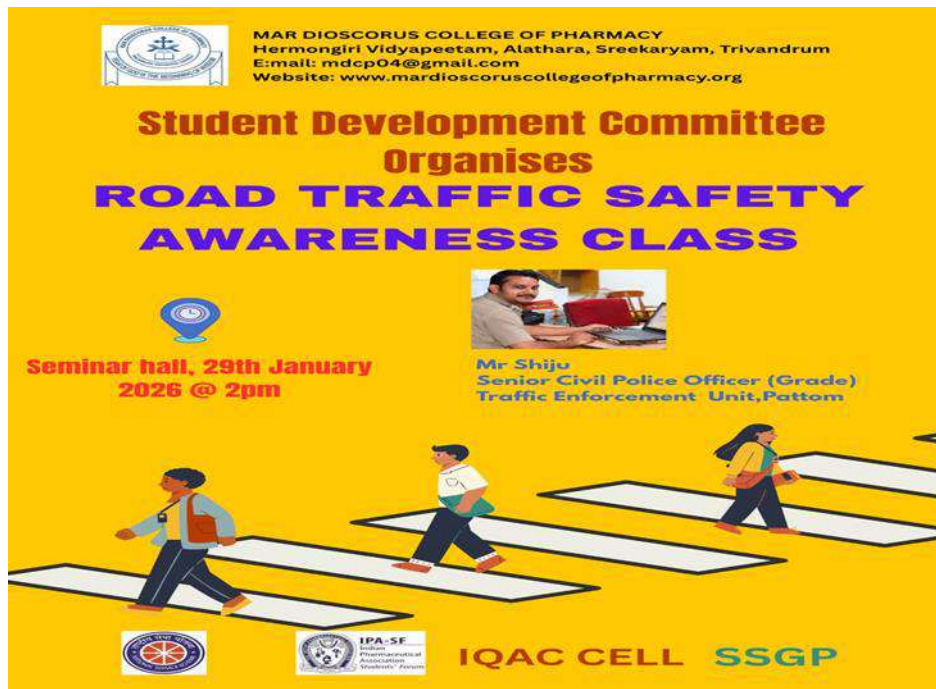

4.DAYS WORKSHOP ON PALLIATIVE CARE

The NSS and Department of Pharmacy Practice, Mar Dioscorus College of Pharmacy (MDCP), in collaboration with Pallium India, organized a two-day training program titled “Palliative Care for Pharmacy Students and Staff” on 3rd and 4th February 2026. The program aimed to sensitize pharmacy students to the principles and practice of palliative care, with a focus on pain management, communication skills, ethical decision-making, and the role of pharmacists in end-of-life care.

The sessions were conducted by eminent resource persons from Pallium India and experts in palliative care. The program included lectures, interactive discussions, case-based learning, pre-test and post-test assessments, and feedback sessions to evaluate learning outcomes.

Session 1: Basics of Palliative Care – Ms. Sheeba R S

The session introduced the concept of palliative care, its philosophy, and its importance in healthcare. The speaker explained that palliative care focuses on improving the quality of life of patients with life-limiting illnesses by addressing physical, psychological, social, and spiritual needs.

Key areas discussed included:

- Definition and principles of palliative care
- Difference between curative care and palliative care
- Concept of total care and multidisciplinary approach
- Spectrum of diseases requiring palliative care in the Indian context
- Models of palliative care service delivery

This session helped students understand that palliative care is not only end-of-life care but a holistic approach starting from diagnosis of serious illness.

Session 2: Introduction to Pain and WHO Analgesic Ladder – Dr. Amritha Thampi

This session focused on pain management, which is a core component of palliative care. The speaker explained:

- Types of pain (nociceptive and neuropathic)
- Principles of symptom control
- WHO three-step analgesic ladder
- Use of non-opioids, weak opioids, and strong opioids
- Adjuvant analgesics and their role in pain management
- Routes of drug administration and when to use alternative routes
- Students learned the rational approach to pain management and how to tailor therapy based on patient needs.

Session 3: Opioids and Their Pharmacology – Dr. Amritha Thampi

This session covered strong opioids under Step 3 of the WHO analgesic ladder. Topics included:

- Morphine: onset, metabolism, dosing, and routes of administration
- Fentanyl: transdermal use, indications, and precautions
- Management of common opioid side effects such as constipation, nausea, and respiratory depression
- Recognition and response to opioid toxicity

This session emphasized safe and responsible use of opioids in palliative care.
